

PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

between Nora, Hõne, Põhja-Sakala and Fladungen

The partnership has the following goals:

- to promote cross-cultural and friendship understanding between communities in our member countries;
- to create and facilitate contacts between partner citizens, having a clear focus on our youth;
- to provide member citizens the opportunity to meet and exchange experiences and knowledge in person;
- to actively promote experience- and knowledge exchange within the municipal area;
- to stimulate exchange within the local business community and other organizations.

Partnership exchange is to take place through contacts between local governments, individual citizens, school classes, businesses and various democratic organizations and associations.

Partnership exchange based on a democratic society can include the following areas: education, culture, cultural history, municipal technology, social services, healthcare, equality, diversity, environment, sports, tourism, youth work and local entrepreneurship.

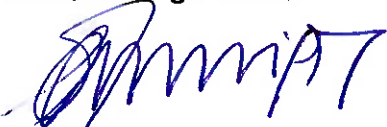
The partner towns meet once a year. Hosting duties rotate among the various municipalities. The topic for the next meeting and the planning for the coming year are decided each time.

To receive funding from various funds, the partner towns can create joint applications for joint projects and arrangements.

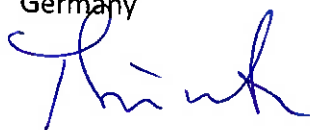
The partnership agreement includes an appendix that, among other things, governs the municipal costs for travel and stay.

This contract is valid under the condition that it is approved by the city council or another municipal body.

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Appendix to the Partnership Agreement

For the partnership connection, the following shall apply, in accordance with the partnership agreement:

The visiting partners pay for their travel to and from the host country unless otherwise agreed. Hosts are responsible for homestay accommodation, living expenses, travel costs in the host country, as well as other costs that arise in connection with the stay and arrangement. Guests are responsible for other costs, such as interpreter fees.

The host municipality does not cover any costs related to illness or accident for guests during their stay in the host country, and legal liability is not excluded.

The host municipality decides the number of the guests to invite as well as the date for the meeting, the venue and the activities.

If funding will be received from European Union and/or partner states, which is not restricted to national budgets, then the general agreement will be that the division of funds will be according to the following key: 50% to the host country and remainder is divided equally among the other members.
